Guideline in-service light vehicles not fitted with identification plates in Queensland

1 Guideline Authority

This guideline is issued under section 14(1)(a) of the *Transport Operations (Road Use Management— Vehicle Standards and Safety) Regulation 2010* (the regulation) in accordance with Part 4, Section 22 of the *Statutory Instruments Act 1992*.

2 Commencement

This guideline commences on 1 August 2014.

3 Regulatory provisions that do not apply

Attaching a compliance or identification plate as required by Schedule 1, Section 12 of the regulation.

4 Application

- 4.1 This guideline applies only to vehicles that:
 - have previously been registered in Queensland; and
 - were not fitted with an identification (compliance) plate as required by
 Schedule 1 Section 12 of the regulation when they were first registered; and
 - this non-compliance was known to the chief executive when the vehicle was first registered in Queensland.
- 4.2 The chief executive will be considered to have known about the non-compliance if a permit issued under section 14(1)(b) of the regulation, was issued to allow the vehicle to be first registered in Queensland.
- 4.3 This guideline does not apply to a vehicle that:
 - is conditionally registered; or
 - does not comply with another requirement of the regulation; or
 - was required to be fitted with an identification plate in accordance with the *Motor Vehicle Standards Act 1989 (Cwlth)*.

5 Operational

5.1 A copy of this guideline does not need to be carried in the vehicle, but a copy must be made available to an authorised officer if requested.

6 Interpretation

- 6.1 Generally, the terms in this guideline, other than the terms mentioned in 6.2, have the meaning given in the regulation or the *Transport Operations (Road Use Management) Act 1995.*
- 6.2 In this guideline:

Conditionally registered means a vehicle registered under section 12(2) of the *Transport Operations (Road Use Management—Vehicle Registration) Regulation* 2010.
